The Art Auction is a key fundraiser for the Marblehead Festival of Arts, held each year over the July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday.

Scheduled for Saturday, April 28 at Abbot Hall, 188 Washington Street, in Marblehead, the fundraiser begins at 6:00 pm with a silent auction, followed by a live auction. The bidding action will be intense as Gene Arnould, owner of the Arnould Gallery & Framery and Leslie Gould, Development Director at the Jewish Community Center, once again headline the annual Art Auction fundraiser as auctioneers.

"Thanks to the generosity of North Shore artists, businesses, and organizations, the Marblehead Festival of Arts Annual Art Auction will feature a wonderful mixture of items for auction," says Tishey Noiseux, Festival board member and auction chair. "I am most excited about the new logo ornament, created by Hestia Creations based on Matt Byer's 2007 Festival logo design. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to bid on the signed artist's proof of what is expected to be the first design in a series of collectible Festival logo ornaments." Other 'one-of-a-kind' auction items include:

- Lunch and tour of the State House with state representative Doug Peterson.
- A front row seat to the start of the Halifax race aboard a BYC vessel.
- A private tour of Abbot Hall.
- An afternoon cruise of Marblehead waters on the 28-foot sailboat, *Kismet*, including gourmet lunch donated by Monet's Garden Art Café in Beverly.

Once again Nordia Kay and Herb Goldberg have teamed up to create a special collector's piece, which combines a watercolor and a black and white photograph to depict a Marblehead scene. This artwork is produced specifically for the Arts Festival Art Auction and many attend the auction just to bid on this outstanding piece.

Many other local artists have contributed art which may be previewed on the MFA website. All media are represented with a vast array of oil paintings, water colors and photography, and crafts including several pieces of exquisite jewelry.
