Marblehead Festival of Arts Announces Lineup for Winter Film Festival

A Program Comprised of Sixteen Short Films

Marblehead, MA (February 4, 2008) – The Marblehead Festival of Arts proudly announces the lineup for its upcoming Winter Film Festival, to be held at the Marblehead Little Theater (MLT) on Wednesday, February 13. The MLT features comfortable seating, a theatre-sized screen, and an excellent audio-video system. The program consists of sixteen short films, including three not screened at the summer Festival. The doors will open at 7:00 pm and the event itself will start at 7:30 pm. Several filmmakers are expected to be on hand for a discussion immediately following the program. Admission is free. These works are intended to show the many ways that film and video can be used as an art form to inform and express. They are not commercial films found in your standard multiplex. While some of these works may certainly be enjoyed by children, not all of the films will be understood by them.
