Applications Now Accepted for MFoA Scholarship Program

Marblehead, MA (March 11, 2008) – The Scholarship Committee of the Marblehead Festival of Arts announced today that applications are being accepted for the 23nd annual MFoA Scholarship Program. Since 1986, the Marblehead Festival of Arts has awarded a scholarship to a high school senior who resides in or attends school in Marblehead and who is pursuing higher education in visual arts, performing arts, crafts, music or drama. In awarding this \$3,000 scholarship, the Festival's objective is to encourage graduates pursuing the arts professionally to acquire sound academic groundings in their chosen fields.

Criteria considered by the Scholarship Committee include financial need; academic and art achievements; art-related and extracurricular activities, both in and out of school; intended vocation; and any honors or special citations received. Tammy Picone Nohelty and Maggie Smist are this year's co-chairpersons heading up the Scholarship Committee.

The scholarship winner will be announced at the Festival's Awards Ceremony on Wednesday, July 2. Recent MFoA Art Scholarship winners are Bradford Smith (2000), Bonnie Fraser (2001), Joseph H. Page (2002), Sara Beesley (2003), Gregory Tufts (2005), Anna Webster (2006), and Elisha Musgraves (2007).
