During Marblehead's Christmas Walk, on December 6 and 7, ballots may be cast at Artisans' Holiday Marketplace in Abbot Hall.

The semifinalist and finalist designs will be displayed at the Logo Premiere Party on January 27, 2009, at The Landing Restaurant and Pub, where the winning logo design and artist will be announced. The new logo will appear on Festival posters and banners, and all memorabilia produced for the 2009 Festival held over the July 4th holiday weekend.
