Marblehead Festival of Arts Set for July 1-5

Marblehead MA (June 21, 2010) – The Marblehead Festival of Arts (MFoA) will host its 45th annual Arts Festival in downtown Marblehead from July 1-5. This North Shore favorite is home to fine arts exhibits, including crafts, drawing, mixed media, painting, photography, printmaking and sculpture created by artists from all over Essex County. In addition, the MFoA features Exhibits specific to seniors and students, musical performances in Marblehead's Crocker Park, a two-day Artisans' Marketplace, Painting-the-Town, a variety of performers at a Street Festival, a Film Festival, a Theatre Festival, a Literary Arts Festival, a Kite Festival, a Sand Sculpture Competition and a Model Boat Building Workshop. Most activities are free of charge. All are detailed at MarbleheadFestival.org.

"This year's Festival will take advantage of the three-day holiday week-end, offering fine arts, musical performances and activities that engage the entire family," says Festival President Jeff Kane. Board member Cathy Michael added, "The Festival of Arts provides generations of tradition and connections with the community. This is a time we all realize how uniquely special it is to live here."

Satellite parking will be available at Marblehead High School, 2 Humphrey Street. A Festival Trolley, free to all, will provide shuttle service between the parking lot and the Festival exhibits and events. The trolley will operate on Saturday, Sunday and Monday, July 3-5, from 9:30 am to 5:30 pm.

The Festival will operate its own Logo Stores at two locations, on July 3-5, 10 am to 5 pm, selling an array of products featuring the award-winning 2010 Festival logo, created by Steve Webster. Proceeds from sales of logo products support the Festival. Among this year's items are a variety of shirts for men, women and children; hats in varied sizes; sweatshirts and fleece vests; bags; sports chairs; metro carts and wine glasses.
