Writers' World Featured at Marblehead Festival of Arts

Marblehead MA (June 21, 2010) — Writers' World, a special event of the Marblehead Festival of Arts (MFoA) during July 1-5, will take place at Unitarian Universalist Church, 28 Mugford Street. Writers' World is a juried Exhibit of original, previously unpublished adult and student fiction, essays and poetry. It will also feature a Literary Arts Café and Workshops on Saturday, July 3, and Sunday, July 4.

"A Poetry Slam" will be led by John Dowds on Saturday, July 3, from 1 to 5 pm. Dowds said, "The poetry slam was invented in the late 1980s by a construction worker who thought traditional poetry readings were boring. He encouraged his friends to bring the poems they read to life and to perform the pieces instead of reading them." Dowds invites everyone to stop by the Workshop to get an "exposure to words, brain teasers and ideas that will make you question, rethink, reword and reinvent all that you think you know."

On Sunday, July 4, from 1 to 3 pm, author and teacher Phyllis Karas will discuss "How to Get Published." According to Karas, "Whether it be magazines or books, fiction or nonfiction, there are no secrets. It's a matter of figuring out what you want to write about, get it written and find the right avenue to make sure others get the chance to read your work. Let's talk about it!"

Cafés and salons have evolved over the centuries as writers have gathered to discuss their craft with other writers. With this historical perspective, the Festival Literary Arts Café is a comfortable place where readers and writers may discuss works while enjoying coffee, tea and light fare.

On Monday, July 5, at 2 pm, the Mugford Street Players will continue a long established tradition and do readings of winning entries from this year's Writers' World works. Please join the Players, along with the authors, to enjoy their contributions to the Festival of the Arts and the art world.
